The original Training Package has now been revised and the 'new' Training Package is available. The revised package has new competencies as well as new industry accepted qualifications that offer enterprises more options for skills development and assessment.

Looking to develop the leadership and communication skills of your team leaders?

Print Training Australia has now been delivering its industry specific Frontline Management program for three years. The program is based on an original course developed by the Mt Eliza Business School. Print Training Australia worked with Mt Eliza to customise and contextualise the program to meet the needs of the printing industry. The program has been delivered in Victoria, South Australia and New South Wales and the feedback from participants and their managers has been excellent. The course can be undertaken by individuals through the Printing Industry Association's regional offices in Adelaide and Sydney or conducted onsite for larger enterprises. The program is delivered over 12 - 14 months with participants undertaking a series of monthly workshops, supported between sessions by a series of workbooks. These workbooks enable the participants to contextualise the learning into their workplace. Participants undertake a 360 degree evaluation pre and post course to aid in assessment of development during the program. The focus of the program is on the development of effective strategies to lead work teams towards achievement of workplace goals. The program has been designed for team leaders, shift supervisors and other employees responsible for leading a work team.

The majority of participants (in NSW and SA) are eligible for \$4,400 in Commonwealth Government incentive funding.

The revised Printing Industry Training Package has a new qualification: Certificate IV in Process Leadership.
